Silver Springs Loop Trail

The Silver Springs Trail passes near your residence and provides easy access to the incredible world of nature which we, in Lafayette, have the good fortune to have as our cohabitant. Nearby are beautiful valleys, peaceful knolls, vistas and canopied pathways all of which becken your company and offer a treasure chest of relaxation and inspiration.

This neighborhood trail has been reconstructed by the California Conservation Corps and the bridges were designed and built as an Eagle Scout project. We encourage you, your family and friends to enjoy your neighborhood trail and to explore the areas beyond by hiking the regional network of trails, all of which are available to you without the use of a car.

The beginning of the Silver Springs Trail is off the cul de sac at the end of Silver Springs Court and the entrance is clearly marked with a trail sign. From there the trail follows the paved driveway on the marked right-of-way, meets the graveled path and climbs the stepped slope to join the loop. At this junction, you may proceed in either direction and return to this point via the loop. To the east, the trail rises quickly to the ridge between Lafayette and Moraga. To the west, the trail meanders across open field, with full views of north Lafayette, and gently climbs through the oak and bay laurel woods to the ridge. On hot summer days it is a very cool and inviting walk of just under a mile.


Lafayette Trail Use Guidelines

Neighborhood trails are for use by hikers and walkers of any age free of charge. Horseback riding is allowed where posted. Radios, record players, amplifiers and similar sound creating devices may not be used in a way which disturbs the peace and comfort of the neighborhood or trail users. Use and/or transport of alcoholic beverages, firearms, weapons, bicycles and motorized vehicles are prohibited on the trails.

Wear appropriate walking or hiking shoes and warm clothing at times of lower temperature.

Trails are open for use from dawn to dusk.
