

Level 2 Tools

Level 2 measures are *easy* to implement and *low cost*:

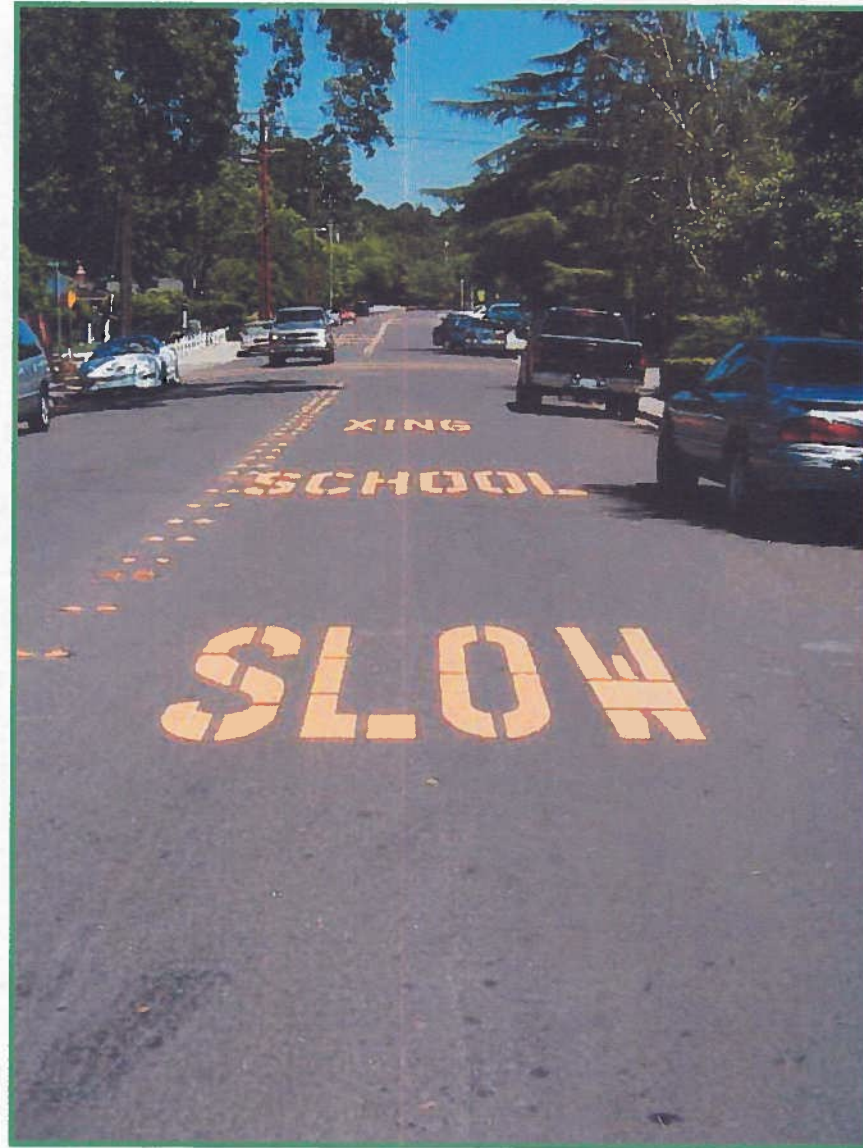
- Crosswalk improvements
- Temporary signs
- Striping narrow lanes and/or centerlines
- Supplemental signs and pavement markings

Level 3 Tools

Level 3 tools require *engineering*, may be *controversial*, and *cost* more:

- Gateway treatment
- Restricted movement signing
- Median island
- Curb extension
- Chicanes, chokers and slow points
- Traffic circle
- Speed humps and cushions
- Raised crosswalks
- Raised intersection

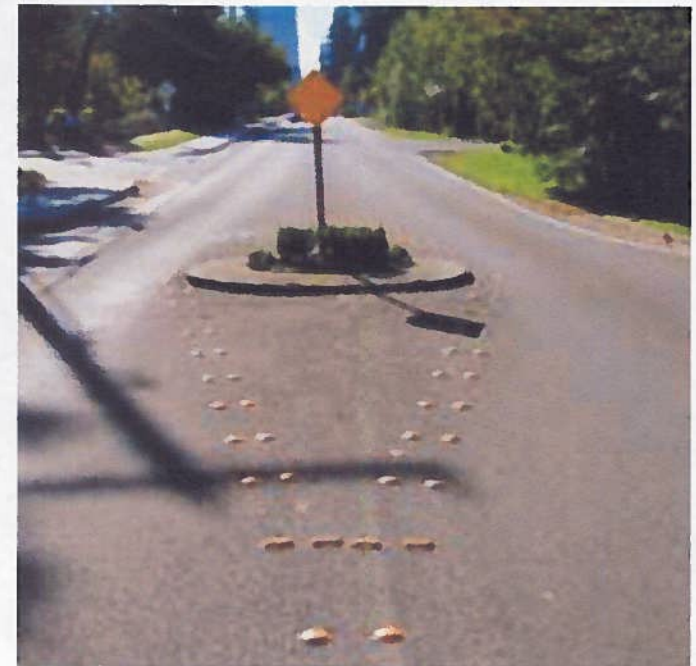
