POOLS & SPAS

Process:

For demolition and construction of pools and spas, please come in during the City's Planning Counter hours, Monday – Friday, 12-5 PM, to speak with the planner-on-duty.

- Demolition and new construction of pools and spas on infill properties:
 - If the demolition or new pool/spa construction includes off-haul of dirt and/or debris, the planner-on-duty will review the quantity of off-haul with the City Engineer to determine if an encroachment permit is required (see below). Once the City Engineer approves the plans, the planner-on-duty will provide a permit for the applicant to submit to the Contra Costa County Building Inspection Department ("CCCBID"). GreenHalo Waste Management plans are typically not required.
- New pools and spas on properties in the Hillside Overlay District: In addition to the process listed above, the planner-on-duty will review manipulation of grade and off-site visibility per Chapter 6-20 (Hillside Regulations) with the Zoning Administrator to determine whether the proposed pool/spa will require further review.
- New pools and spas on properties with Creek Setbacks:
 No permanent structures are permitted within <u>creek setbacks</u>, including pools and spas.
- Encroachment Permits: May be required for off-haul of dirt and/or debris to ensure that truck traffic does not damage the road, to be determined by the City Engineer.

Submittal Requirements:

- Site Plans (3 Sets) should include the following:
 - Property address and parcel number,
 - North arrow and scale,
 - Square footage of impervious surfaces, pool dimensions, cut & fill calculations, cubic yards of off-haul, truckloads of dirt/debris, and path of travel/roads.
 - All CCCBID requirements, including building code setbacks.

Fees:

The City will calculate and charge fees for pools and spas based on net increase of <u>impervious surfaces</u>. If the project is subject to a Hillside Development Permit or Grading Permit, application fees will be required.

Please contact <u>other agencies</u> directly to determine what fees may apply to your project, as each entity has a separate fee schedule.

Other Agencies:

Central Contra Costa Sanitary District (CCCSD)

Please check in with the CCCSD directly to determine what permits are required. Water drained from pools requires a discharge permit from CCCleanwater.org or CentralSan.org.

Contra Costa County Building Inspection Department (CCCBID)

Please check in with the CCCBID directly for California Building Code requirements for setbacks, safety features, and submittal requirements.
