**WHEREAS,** the number of hate crimes across the United States has increased dramatically over the past couple of years; and

**WHEREAS,** the City of Lafayette City Council reaffirmed their commitment to being a welcoming, inclusive, tolerant, and safe community for all with Resolution 2020-41; and

**WHEREAS,** education, compassion, and cooperation are key to unlocking understanding and embracing differences between people; and

**WHEREAS,** the City of Lafayette joins other communities around the state in recognizing United Against Hate Week as an important step in bridging divisions as well as strengthening our communities.

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED** that the City Council of the City of Lafayette, CA does hereby proclaim November 12-18, 2023 as "United Against Hate Week" and recognizes that it is an important step in bridging divisions and healing communities.
