THE NEW LAW

Starting July 1, 2024, operating gas leaf blowers will no longer be allowed in Lafayette. Property owners and homeowners are responsible for all violations where gas leaf blowers are used on their property.

Electric leaf blowers are still allowed and only from 7am to 10pm.

ENFORCEMENT

Property owners are subject to citations which start at \$100 for the first violation.

RESOURCES

Since January 2024, the State of California has banned the sale of gaspowered leaf blowers. Lafayette's new law also bans the use of gaspowered leaf blowers within our community. You can purchase an electric leaf blower at many local hardware stores and landscaping equipment providers. There are handheld and backpack styles and models that have batteries that can last 2-4 hours.

HARMS OF GAS LEAF BLOWERS

- Noise pollution and hearing loss
- Cancer-causing toxic gases (formaldehyde, benzene, smog, ozone)

HOW CAN I HELP?

- Help educate your neighbors and local landscapers to make them aware!
- Ask your landscaper to make the switch now to electric leaf blowers, vacuums or rakes / push brooms / leaf sweepers.
- Relax your aesthetic expectations.
 Prioritize pathways and storm drains you want cleared. Negotiate with your landscaper how much time vs. how clean you want your property ("do you best to get most of the leaves, maybe not all of the leaves").
- Leaves are a great natural mulch, so consider leaving the leaves in your garden and under shrubs. Otherwise, make sure leaves go into your green bin with your organics and food waste!
- Provide electric equipment, an electric outlet, or a charged battery for your landscaper to use/access when working on your property.
